CCWSC WATER DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

What's happening this month

- We have added a bulletin board outside of the main water department building to post public notices for members.
- The CCWSC Board of Director's met last night to discuss the recommendations on refurbishing the 2,500-gallon pressure tank or replacing the tank with a 5,000-gallon pressure tank. This tank has been out of commission and needs to be back online for compliance. If we refurbished the tank, it would be 30% of the cost of a new larger tank and in a year, we would have to purchase a bigger tank to be in compliance with TCEQ. The Board thought it prudent and took the advice from Mercer Engineering and Bull Dog Steel on recommendations and voted to replace the tank. CCWSC will sell the existing tank as salvage material. We will be taking a loan out with Co-Bank to replace this tank for \$85k.
- The Generator is still be evaluated to see if we can get the electrical cables changed out to fix the issue of holding the load of the well.
- G & W Engineering continues the work on the 120k gallon ground water storage tank replacement project. We received good news from G & W Engineering this week when members of our board met with them in Port Lavaca. They explained that the cost of the tank will be less than originally expected that will help offset expenses. They have submitted the plan to TCEQ for approval. Once we get the approval, they will start the foundation work for the tank. Clark Constructor's will be handling the demolition and that work will be starting soon.
- We are still researching the reverse osmosis water and ice kiosk services for the community within our gates. We will keep you updated on our progress.

Phil Taylor is registered to take his Customer Service Inspection License and Jacob Bell is registered to take his Class D License. The Executive Administrator will start taking Class D classes to support the corporation with regulatory compliance.
