CCWSC WATER DEPARTMENT HIGHLIGHTS

What's happening this month

- TCEQ approved our plan for the 5k gallon pressure tank.
- Gonzalez Contracting, Inc. started this month on the foundation work for the 120k gallon ground water tank, but has been delayed to due to the inclement weather. Work should begin again after the holidays.
- Gonzales Contracting, Inc. was awarded the bid for the foundation work for the 5k gallon pressure tank.
- Forge-Global Industries is currently fabricating our 120k gallon tank and it will be installed in February 2023.
- We now have the timeline from G&W Engineering for the 120k gallon water tank. We have placed this on our website and also have sent by email with this newsletter.
- On 12/23/22 our community had a hard freeze and this storm caused damage in the plant. We had a chlorinator pipe burst. We lost pressure for a short period of time and with the combination of the pipe bursting TCEQ required us to go on Boil Water Notice. The damage was repaired the next day. We tested the water on 12/27/22, as soon as the laboratory was open for business, as required by TCEQ regulatory compliance. Our test results were emailed to us on 12/28/22 in the afternoon. We sent out a rescind boil water notice as soon as we got the results that our water was safe for consumption on 12/28/22. Every customer was emailed out the boil water notice and rescind boil water notice. If you did not receive the email most likely it went into your spam folder. Please put CCWSC as a trusted site in your email settings. This will prevent our emails from going to your spam folder.
- Mercer Controls has been collaborating with WPI to get our generator working to hold the complete load of the plant. They are still continuing to work on this to salvage the generator.
